## Taste test: Chobani Greek Yogurt

**The scoop:** Chobani yogurt is made by AgroFarma in upstate New York. The company says it contains five live and active cultures -- including three types of probiotics (the good bacteria) -- and no growth hormones. Varieties include low-fat plain and pineapple flavors and nonfat plain, honey, peach, pomegranate, strawberry, vanilla and blueberry flavors.

**The taste:** We tried the nonfat peach yogurt and the taste was tangy and not too sweet. It is smooth and creamy with a texture similar to custard. Like many Greek-style yogurts, it's thicker than many common store brands because it has been strained to remove the whey.

**The price:** At some Meijer stores, a 6-ounce container sells for \$1.39 -- about double of most store brands. It's also sold at some Kroger, Hiller's and Plum Market stores. Some varieties are available in 16-ounce containers for \$2.99 and 32-ounce containers for \$4.99.

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
